It is the opinion of some Egyptologists that she actually led troops to quell a rebellion in southern Upper Egypt while the King fought the threatening Hyksos in the northern Lower Egypt. This medal was found in the tomb of Queen Ahhotep when it was discovered and can be seen in the Cairo Museum.
