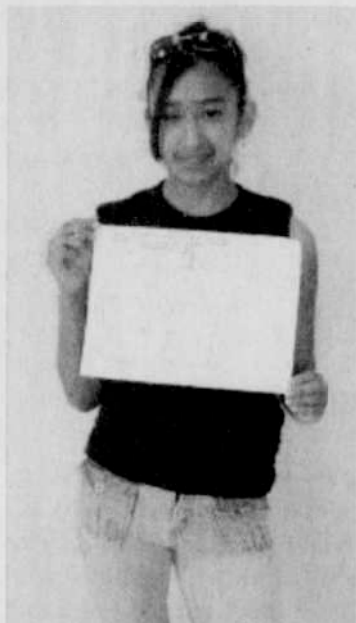

### University of Oregon announces degree candidates

A total of 4,363 students who have completed work toward a degree during the 2005-06 academic year are eligible to participate in the spring ceremonies, which begin at 12:30 p.m., on Saturday, June 17 at McArthur Court, 1601 University St. No tickets are required and doors will open at 10:30 a.m.

President Dave Frohnmayer will preside over the university-wide exercises and also will present the university's 2006 Distinguished Service Awards and Presidential Medals. Recipients of several distinguished teaching awards for faculty members also will be recognized.

Local students graduating include: Heppner- Jonathan Thomas Bennett, bachelor of science, political science; Kevin D. Drake, bachelor of science, psychology; Leland Rill, bachelor of arts, sociology; and Camille Emily Hilton Sykes, bachelor of arts, multimedia design.

Seating in McArthur Court will be available on a first-come, first-served basis. Graduating students will sit on the main floor and guests will sit in the balconies. Limited seating will be

available on the main floor on the east side of McArthur Court for those wheelchairs or with other special mobility needs. A sign language interpreter will be present. Guests with impaired hearing may wish to sit in the first few rows of the southwest stands closest to the speaker's platform.

Individuals planning to attend commencement are advised to arrive early, as campus parking is very limited. Free parking will be available in lots located at East 15th Avenue and Columbia Street and East 14th Avenue and Kincaid Street, as well as at specially marked parking meters at the edge of campus. In addition to the university-wide exercises on June 17, each school or college-including individual College of Arts and Sciences departments-will hold ceremonies at various campus locations on Thursday, Friday or Saturday, June 15-17.

### OSU to graduate what may be its largest class in history

Oregon State University will graduate what may be the largest class in its history on Sunday, June 18, when it holds its 137th annual commencement. The ceremony, which will be broadcast live over Oregon Public Broadcasting, begins at 2 p.m. in Reser Stadium.

Warren Washington, an OSU alumnus and outgoing chairman of the prestigious National Science Board, will give the commencement address.

About 4,300 students will graduate from OSU in 2006 with some 4,440 degrees. Both would be records, according to Barbara Balz, the university's registrar. Oregon State has attracted record enrollments over the past several years, leading to larger and larger graduating classes.

Last year, OSU graduated 4,083 students who received 4,219 degrees.

OSU President Ed Ray and the academic deans will pass out diplomas to graduating students. Oregon State is one of the few

universities of its size to present actual diplomas to its graduates during commencement.

In addition to the degrees, OSU will give honorary doctorate degrees to Washington and rural economics pioneer Emery Castle, and its Distinguished Service Award to business entrepreneur and philanthropist Bernie Newcomb.
