

Sheriff's Report

The Morrow County Sheriff's Office reports handling the following business:

Pheasants Forever raises over \$15,000 for upland bird habitats

The Columbia Plateau Chapter of Pheasants Forever held its first fundraiser banquet and auction April 8 of this year. Over \$15,000 was raised for upland bird habitat projects in this area. "Now it's time to get some projects in the works and use this money to improve wildlife habitat on those areas where it is needed," said Skip Matthews, Columbia Plateau Chapter President.

Pheasants Forever is dedicated to the protection and enhancement of pheasants, quail and other upland wildlife through habitat improvement, public awareness, education and advocacy for sound land management policy. Although time was limited this spring to install many practices the chapter did get

one demonstration project off the ground. "We hurried around and were able to get a basic habitat project installed," said Matthews. This project was done with cooperation from local landowners along with Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife, Natural Resources Conservation Service, Pheasants Forever, Morrow County Grain Growers and local volunteers. "It basically is the kind of project that we would like to see on an area that previously had little to offer in the way of wildlife habitat," said Matthews. "The ODFW and Pheasants Forever went in and burned an old CRP stand to invigorate the existing grasses. Then a small grain food plot and shrubs were

planted. To complete the project, a wildlife watering guzzler was put in."

Depending on the area being developed there are funds available through local state and federal agencies and now Pheasants Forever has some funds to help with these projects. The Columbia Plateau Chapter would like to hold an informal sign-up for landowners wanting to install the kind of projects that would improve an area for upland birds. Anyone interested in doing one of these projects should pick up a sign-up form at the Pheasants Forever office in Heppner in the Pettyjohn Office Building or the SWCD office in Condon at the Dunn Brothers Building, or call Skip Matthews at 676-5490.
