To get your washing started it takes eight quarters and you can add up to \$5 at one time to keep it going.

DA's Report

The Morrow County DA's office reports handling the following business:

Jose Manuel Chavez-Acosta was convicted of Contempt of Court/Punitive, an unclassified misdemeanor. He was sentenced to 30 suspended days in jail, one year bench probation, 10 hours of community and payment of \$418 in fines and fees.

Jackie K. Roberts admitted to violation of probation allegations for Possession of a Controlled Substance. Roberts was sentenced to 10 days in jail, 90 days in the work release center and a continuation of probation.

Seth Lee Osgood was convicted for Possession of Methamphetamine, a Class C felony, and Felon in Possession of a Fire Arm, a

Class C felony. His driver's license was suspended for six months and he was sentenced to 19 months in jail, three years probation and payment of \$528 in fines and fees. He was also convicted of Possession of a Controlled Substance 2, a Class C felony. He was sentenced to 180 days in jail and two years probation. This sentence will be served concurrently with the previous sentence. Thirdly, Osgood was convicted of Driving while Suspended/Misdemeanor, a Class A misdemeanor. He was sentenced to pay \$1633 in fines and fees.

Joel Ernesto Rodriguez was found in violation of probation allegations for Burglary in the First Degree and Delivery of a Controlled Substance within 1000 feet of a school. Rodriguez's probation was revoked and he was sentenced to 22 months in jail and 36 months probation.

Ricky Bee Roberts was convicted of Driving Under the Influence of Intoxicants, a Class A misdemeanor. Roberts' driver's license was suspended for one year and he was sentenced to 180 days in jail, with 150 days suspended, two years bench probation, 80 hours of community service and payment of \$1793 in fines and fees.

Martin Damien Enright was convicted of Failure to Register as a Felony Sex Offender, a Class C felony. He is required to register as a sex offender and was sentenced to two years supervised probation, 60 days in jail, 80 hours community service and payment of \$1778 in fines and fees.

Jason Lee Aitken was convicted of Assault of a Public Safety Officer, a Class C felony. He was sentenced to 15 months in jail and three years probation. He was also

convicted of Assault 4+, a Class A misdemeanor. For this he was sentenced to 24 months bench probation. He was also sentenced to pay \$988 in fines and fees.

Pedro Santos Trujillo was convicted of Harassment, a Class B misdemeanor. He was sentenced to 90 suspended days in jail, one year bench probation, 20 hours community service and payment of \$913 in fines and fees.

Douglas Duane Jones was convicted of Theft 3+, a Class C misdemeanor. He was sentenced to 30 suspended days in jail, one year bench probation and payment of \$663 in fines and fees and \$50 in restitution.

Mario Montes-Landeros was convicted of Criminal Mischief 2, a Class A misdemeanor. He was sentenced to 180 suspended days in jail, two years bench probation, 40 hours community service and payment of \$663 in fines and fees and \$99.67 in restitution. He was also convicted of Unlawfully Applying Graffiti, a Class A violation. He was sentenced to pay \$317 in fines and fees.

Amy Rane Waddell was convicted of Harassment Physical +, a Class B misdemeanor. She was sentenced to 90 suspended days in jail, one year bench probation and payment of \$1033 in fines and fees.

Edwin Arnulfo Guardado was convicted of Rape-3, a Class C felony. He must register as a sex offender and was sentenced to two years supervised probation, completion of 80 hours of community service and payment of \$216 in fines and fees.
