Heppner community helps reduce the risk of stroke

Residents living in and around the Heppner community can be screened to reduce their risk of having a stroke. Life Line Screening will be at the St. Patrick's Senior Center on Sept. 5. The site is located at 182 N. Main in Heppner. Appointments will begin at 11 a.m.

A stroke, also known as a "brain attack," is ranked as the third leading killer in the world and the second among women. Through preventive screenings, the risk of having a stroke can be greatly reduced.

Screenings are fast, painless and low cost. They involve the use of ultrasound technology and scan for potential health problems related to: blocked arteries, which can lead to a stroke; aortic aneurysms, which can lead to a ruptured aorta; and hardening of the arteries in the legs, which are a strong predictor of heart disease. Also offered for men and women, is a bone density screening to assess their risk

for osteoporosis.

Each screening requires 10 minutes or less to complete. A complete vascular screening package, including the Stroke/Carotid Artery, Abdominal Aortic Aneurysm and Ankle Brachial Index (hardening of the arteries) screenings is \$109. Sign-up for a complete vascular package; include the osteoporosis screening and pay only \$129.

Life Line Screening was established in 1993. Over 60 ultrasound teams are on staff to travel to your local community, bringing the screenings to you. These non-invasive, inexpensive and painless, ultrasound tests help people identify their risk for stroke, vascular diseases or osteoporosis early enough for their physician to begin preventive procedures.

Kite tubing prohibited at Willow Creek Reservoir and other Corps resevoirs

Kite tubing is now prohibited at all Portland District, U. S. Army Corps of Engineers-managed reservoirs in the Columbia, Willamette and Rogue river basins, the agency has announced.

Effective immediately, the ban includes the use of any "airborne towables," which are defined as inflatable recreational devices designed to go airborne with a rider while being towed by a boat, whether or not they are specifically marketed as kite tubes.

The effected reservoirs are: Willow Creek in Morrow County; Applegate and Lost Creek in

Jackson County; Big Cliff and Detroit in Marion/Linn County; Blue River, Cottage Grove, Cougar, Dexter, Dorena, Fall Creek, Fern Ridge, Hills Creek and Lookout Point in Lane County; Foster and Green Peter in Linn County.

Additionally, the Corps is restricting use of the devices in the pools created by Bonneville, The Dalles and John Day dams on the Columbia River.

Portland District Commander Col. Thomas O'Donovan imposed the ban because of the high potential for serious injuries caused by uncontrolled flight of these devices, posing risks to the rider, as well as to others who may be in the area.
