Also on the morning agenda is a presentation on on-farm biofuels production by local growers and an update on the Oregon Department of Agriculture's weed-free forage program. The board will tour the nearby Port of Morrow in the afternoon.

On day two, the board will receive an update

on PURS- the Pesticide Use Reporting System that is expected to be operational in 2007. The meeting will conclude with reports by ODA Director Katy Coba and board subcommittees on land use and water issues, government relations, technology and marketing. A public comment period is scheduled for day two of the meeting at 11 a.m.

The board meeting begins at 8:30 a.m., on Wednesday, Sept. 6 at the offices of the Port of Morrow, 2 Marine Drive, in Boardman. The meeting will resume on Thursday, Sept. 7 at 8:30 a.m. The meeting is open to the public.

Inland Northwest Musicians announces upcoming concert offerings

Inland Northwest Musicians, now with five performing ensembles, is proud to announce their eighth season of concerts and young people's offerings. The five concert ensembles are: Inland Northwest Orchestra, Inland Northwest Chorale, Willow Creek Symphony, Willow Creek Singers and the Wallowa Valley Orchestra. On tap for the season are 24 events to be presented in 19 different cities and towns in Northeast Oregon and Southeast Washington.

From the spectacular guest artist opening concert in October, through a world premiere presentation by a noted composer in December and finishing with solo performances by Young Artist's Competition contestants and two outdoor summer 'Pops' concerts, the season program promises frequent and vivid opportunities to sample fine music by accomplished musicians who are also your friends and neighbors.

Primarily volunteer musicians from throughout the performing area, Inland Northwest Musicians members rehearse and perform for the love of music and the satisfaction gained from the performance. The organization is recognized as a charitable institution under the provisions of Chapter 501(c)(3) of the IRS code and donations are tax-deductible. Funding comes from donations, sustaining membership donations, grants, sponsorships by local businesses, industries and by individuals and from other fundraising activities such as an annual dinner/auction.

As a part of their goal of bringing fine music to the cities and towns of the rural area, INWM members participate in a number of youth-related activities. Each season Young People's Concerts are performed during the school day for

elementary students from local schools who are bussed to a central facility for a performance. One is held in Echo and another in Wallowa. Annually, young performers gather in Pendleton for the Young Artist's Competition where they compete for cash prizes and for an opportunity to perform as guest artists with the Inland Northwest Symphony Orchestra. A grant-funded activity called 'Dinner Music' invites music students to attend an evening event where they have dinner with orchestra members and then attend a rehearsal, sitting in the orchestra with their mentors. In addition, musicians have been active in making presentations on a monthly basis in schools where music programs have been abandoned.

The groups are led by Musical Director and Conductor R. Lee Friese of Athena. He is assisted by associate conductors Anthony Marks of Walla Walla and by Dane Mickelson of Wallowa.
