

Sheriff's Report

The Morrow County Sheriff's Office reports handling the following business:

Sept. 6: Boardman PD cited Celia Villalobos Vigil, 31, for driving uninsured and for not having an operating license.

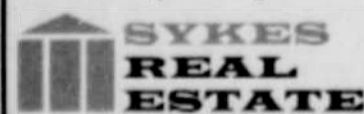
