

## Sheriff's Report

The Morrow County Sheriff's Office reports handling the following business:

MCSO, Boardman Police Dept. received a 911 call from a female juvenile in Boardman. Dispatch could hear a female yelling in the background. The female juvenile said, "Okay, sorry," and hung up. Units were dispatched for a possible disturbance. On call back a female juvenile advised that someone attempted to choke her near an apartment.

MCSO received a report from a caller near Boardman of a non-injury motor vehicle accident; the driver hit a deer.

MCSO received a report from a caller in Irrigon of a suspicious vehicle in the area of the park. It was determined to be the undersheriff who was watching a group of juveniles walking in and out of traffic.

MCSO, Heppner Fire Dept. received a report from a caller in Heppner that a male subject was stuck in the elevator at the senior center.

MCSO received a report from a caller in Heppner that approximately 15-20 high school students were outside the Shell station asking people to buy them beer.
