CSEPP donates security cameras to Irrigon Schools

surveillance within the zone and will also monitor the perimeter of these zones. The cameras will connect through the district's fiber to a central server running software which is accessible via the internet. The system is expandable to up to 50 cameras per server.

According to information supplied by Intermountain Technology, the cameras, on a normal basis, are fixed at a predetermined position and record to the server when motion is detected. In the event of an emergency, a school official, public safety officer or emergency personnel can access cameras through the Internet to examine the situation. They can then take control of the camera to zoom in and identify students, staff, and perpetrators and can even zoom in to read license plates.

Intermountain Technology estimated that the project would cost approximately \$41,608 including \$8,760 for server licensing; an additional \$1,500 for a yearly software upgrade; and an additional \$18,570 for contractor costs for ACH, Irrigon Jr./Sr. High, Irrigon Elementary and MEC for a grand total of \$61,678.

The board also heard a safety report from ACH Principal John Sebastian and discussed current procedures in place in the event of an armed intruder or other emergency at one of the schools and plans for possible improvement and updating of those procedures. In the event of a chemical emergency, the schools in Irrigon would be on automatic lock-down and no one could enter or leave the school buildings until the emergency passes.

In other business, the board:

-toured the Morrow Education Center and presented an award to their staff. They were honored for their alternative education program and for greatly increasing enrollment and improving attendance.

-heard a report from board Chair Craig Miles on the Oregon School Board Association Governance Committee, of which he is a member.

-approved a cooperative sponsorship for softball between Heppner High School and Ione High School.

-accepted and recognized CSEPP for their gift for Irrigon schools.

-approved policy which prohibits staff, students and guests from connecting any hardware,

such as their own laptop computers, personal computers, cameras, external drives, to the MCSD's network without specific permission prior to use. The form must be signed by the district user and authorized district representatives and will be filed at the local school's office. Approval is valid for the school year in which it was approved.

- approved resignations from: Susan Hisler, Heppner Junior High head track coach; Theresa Rushing, HHS two-hour assistant cook; Dean Peck, Riverside High School assistant baseball coach; Rachel Reyes, ACH Title I assistant.
