

Sheriff's Report

The Morrow County Sheriff's Office reports handling the following business:
 -MCSO warned a driver for blocking the driveway at the Forest Service in Heppner.
 -MCSO received a report about a cat that needed to be put down. The cat was very sick and hardly able to walk. The cat was going to be transported to Pet Rescue.
 -MCSO received a report that a washing machine was taken from a residence in Boardman.
 -MCSO, Heppner FD and Lexington Ambulance responded to a Motor Vehicle Accident on Hwy 207 MP 18 towards Hermiston. The driver was believed to be injured or possibly fatal. A second

caller reported that the driver was conscious and breathing and lying outside the vehicle with lots of blood around.
