

Hospice of America teleconference to be held in Heppner

The 14th annual Hospice Foundation of America teleconference, Living with Grief: Before and After the Death, will be held Thursday, March 22, from 10:30 a.m. until 1 p.m. at the Seventh-Day Adventist Church in Heppner.

HFA's 2007 teleconference will explore the most current theoretical perspectives on loss and grief as ex-

perienced by persons throughout a life-limiting illness and by survivors after the death. A particular focus will be on areas where understanding of grief has been challenged. The program will be useful to a range of professionals who provide bereavement counseling or work with the bereaved.

This teleconference is ideal for psychologists,

counselors, clergy, social workers, nurses and other health care workers, funeral directors, educators, teachers and school-based personnel. The information will also be helpful to individuals who offer education on loss, grief, dying or death.

State funding enhances development at the Port of Morrow

The Oregon Economic and Community Development Department (OECD) awarded the Port of Morrow a \$2 million loan and \$500,000 grant in February to help fund the East Beach Infrastructure Project. Port Manager Gary Neal said the funding will be used to extend water, wastewater and sanitary lines into the East Beach Industrial Park, clearing the way for development of the site. The Port is in final discussions with several businesses interested in locating at the site, Neal said.

"This investment by the state and the Port will directly lead to new jobs for our people in our region," Neal added.

The total cost of the project is \$2,864,353, including \$364,353 provided by the Port. The work is scheduled for completion by the end of May. Forest Service recruits youth for YCC program

The Forest Service, Heppner Ranger District, is recruiting four young people, between the ages of 15 and 18, for summer employment through the Youth Conservation Corps program.

"The type of work our YCC crews accomplish include noxious weed removal, wildlife habitat improvement, slash piling, trail and campground maintenance," said Tom Mafera, Heppner District Ranger.

The eight-week program begins June 25, 2007 and ends August 17, 2007. Participants will be paid the current Oregon minimum wage per hour.

Applications will be accepted from Thursday, March 22, through 2 p.m. on Wednesday, April 18. Participants will be selected on a random basis on April 18 at 4 p.m.

No previous experience is required. Applicants must be 15 years old and not reach age 19 during the term of employment in the program, and have a social security number, or have made application to obtain one. Applicants must also obtain parental or legal guardian consent to enroll in the program.

Applicants must be able to provide transportation to and from the Heppner District Office. The Forest Service will provide transportation from the District Office to the field work-site. Applications may be obtained at the Heppner District Office or at local high schools.
