Seven Gilliam, Morrow liquor sellers say no to minor alcohol sales

Seven of eight licensed businesses in Gilliam and Morrow counties refused to sell alcohol to a minor during a recent compliance operation conducted by the Oregon Liquor Control Commission.

These liquor businesses said no to the minor: Boardman - Boardman Liquor Store and La Serenata Family Mexican Restaurant; Condon - Condon Liquor Store and Murray's Condon Pharmacy; Heppner - Heppner Family Foods and The Country Rose; and Irigton - Huwe's Has It All.

One business in Gilliam County sold to the minor. Store clerks who provide alcohol to the minor are cited into court and face at least a \$350 administrative fine. Waiters, servers, bartenders and other OLCC service permittees face a \$300 administrative fine. And business owners - licensees - will be fined up to \$1,600 for a first violation, even if the sale is made by an employee.

An OLCC inspector and two minor volunteers did the compliance testing May 26 as part of the OLCC's priority effort to fight underage drinking.

In a compliance test, the underage volunteer attempts to buy alcohol from licensees or their employees to determine if they are properly checking identification and obeying state law prohibiting alcohol sales to anyone under 21. The minors are supervised by OLCC inspectors or other law officers, carry their own legal ID and are advised not to disguise their age or encourage the sale of alcohol.

The OLCC tested about 1,600 licensed liquor businesses in 2006, and a number of police agencies also do compliance checks.

The OLCC offers training to store clerks, service permit holders and others on ID checking, identifying false identification and laws regarding minors and alcohol.

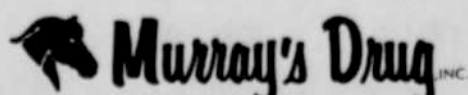
