

Local students make OSU honor roll

Oregon State University has announced the students who have made the scholastic honor roll spring term.

A total of 506 students earned straight-A (4.0). Another 2,288 earned a B-plus (3.5) or better to make the listing. To be on the honor roll, students must carry at least 12 graded hours of course work.

OLCC distributes spirits revenue

The Oregon Liquor Control Commission sent \$151,247 for May to Baker, Grant, Harney, Malheur, Morrow, Umatilla, Union, and Wallowa counties and their 52 cities in the total statewide distilled spirits revenue distribution of \$11.1 million.

The OLCC follows a per-capita distribution formula based on Oregon's population of 3.69 million. For May it was 28.5 cents per person for counties; 82 cents a person for cities. The breakdown was: 36 counties, 10 percent, \$1.05 million; 241 cities, 20 percent, \$2.1 million; state general fund, 56 percent, \$5.9 million; city revenue sharing account, 14 percent, \$1.47 million; state Addiction and Mental Health Division, \$570,045; and Oregon Wine Board, \$17,864.

OLCC revenue is derived from the sale of distilled spirits in 241 liquor stores, taxes on malt beverages and wine, license fees, and fines for liquor law violations. Last month's revenue share was \$10.9 million.

The OLCC collects privilege taxes of \$2.60 for a 31-gallon barrel of malt beverage, 67 cents a gallon for taxable wine with an alcohol content of 14 percent or under and 77 cents on taxable wine over 14 percent. Of that, 2 cents a gallon goes to the Oregon Wine Board to fund research and promotion.

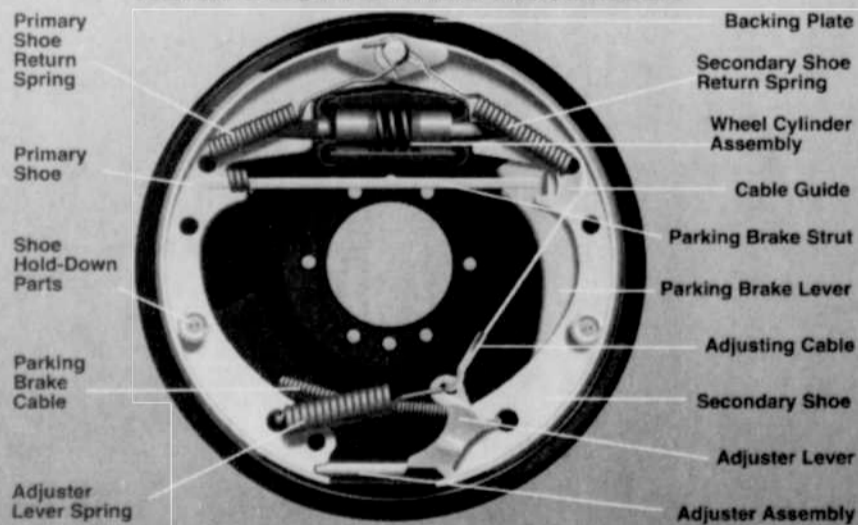

The Friday, July 6, Jack and Jill tournament at the Willow Creek Country Club has been cancelled.

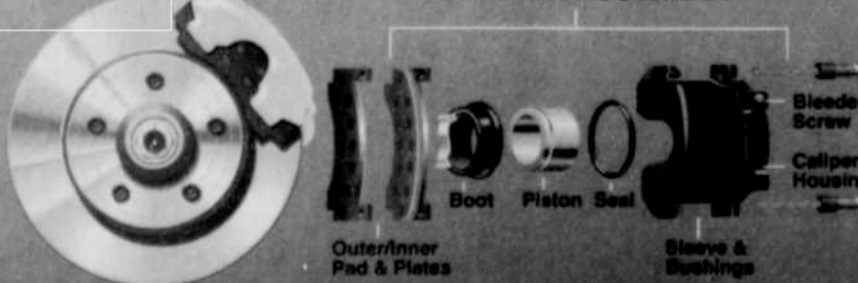

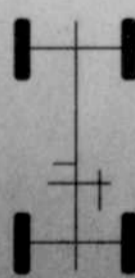
