

Roy Proctor Post transplant treatment at half-way mark

Saturday, July 7, marked day 51, post-marrow transplant for Roy Proctor of Heppner. After much preparation, a bone marrow stem cell transplant was completed on May 17 at the Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center in New York City.

Proctor was diagnosed in 2000 with Fanconi Anemia, a rare genetic disease. Roy's mother, Kay Proctor, is in New York with him. According to Kay, Roy's progress is "miraculous" and the whole family is very grateful for the support of the community.
