Victor B. Nash

Victor B. "Bud" Nash, 86, died Friday, July 6, 2007, in Pendleton following complications from pulmonary fibrosis.

A funeral service was held Saturday, July 14, at New Hope Community Church in Hermiston. Interment followed at Pleasant View Cemetery in Stanfield. A dinner was served at the church following the interment.

Mr. Nash was born June 7, 1921, on the Nash Ranch in Winlock, near Spray, to Ray and Winifred Nash.

Mr. Nash attended grade schools at Cove, Winlock, and Ridgeview, and either rode his horse or lived near the schools in a cabin. He attended Wheeler High School and graduated in 1941.

He was a member of the U.S. Coast Guard Merchant Marines during World War II, serving in the South Pacific from 1944 to 1945. Following his honorable discharge, he returned to work on the family ranch.

On August 18, 1951, he married Ellen Snabel in Redmond. They operated the Nash Ranch, raising cattle, pigs, chickens, sheep, alfalfa hay and wheat. In 1993, they moved to Stanfield where they raised hay.

Mr. Nash was a member of the Oregon Cattlemen's Association, the Spray School Board, was a 4-H Livestock Leader, member of the PTA, and a member of the Spray Grange. He also helped at the Spray Rodeo for many years.

He loved the outdoors and hunting, and riding on the Middle Fork of the John Day. He also enjoyed going to livestock sales, tending to his hay field and orchard and helping his son, Joe, on his tree farm.

He is survived by his wife Ellen; children, Vickie Vaughn, Ontario, Bill and wife Marla Nash of Beaverton and Joe and wife Renee Nash of Stanfield; sisters Diana Britt of Pilot Rock and Roberta Alexander of Pendleton; brothers Harry Nash of Heppner and Jake Nash of Caldwell, Idaho; nine grandchildren; six great-grandchildren; and many nieces and nephews.

He enjoyed fishing on the Grande Ronde and Columbia Rivers and competing in science fairs and in the battle of the book competition champion team at Hawthorne School in Pendleton. At Koko Head school in Honolulu, Hawaii, he won the Citizen of the Year award and won an all

expense paid trip to San Diego, Calif., to play in the world Pokemon tournament. He was ranked 58th in the world and third in the state of Oregon.

At Conestoga Middle School in Beaverton, Terjeson won the Citizen of the Month award several times, was selected for the rookie team for Lego Robotics and was awarded honors in the John Hopkins National Academic Talent Search. He enjoyed playing the trumpet and was selected to speak at his eighth-grade graduation.

At Southridge High School in Beaverton, he excelled in Japanese, history, math and literature and worked the sound system for school musicals. His peers voted him Duke of Intellect for donating the most money for their sister school in Matala, Africa, to build a science lab. He was a mentor to young budding scientists and was a camp counselor for two years for Camp Invention.

Terjeson was to be a junior and was working towards earning the International Baccalaureate diploma.

He enjoyed Harry Potter, his friends and listening to technology podcasts.

He was a member of Peace Lutheran Church in Pendleton, Calvary by the Sea in Honolulu, Hawaii, and St. Matthews Lutheran

Church in Beaverton.

He is survived by his parents, Matthew J. Terjeson and Jan Peterson-Terjeson; sister Lydia Terjeson; grandparents Barbara Hale of Pendleton, Herbert Peterson of Ione and James and Marilyn Terjeson of Pendleton; aunts Robin Terjeson and Elizabeth Peterson; uncles Todd Peterson and Treve Peterson; cousins Renee and Haylie Peterson of Ione; and extended family in Umatilla and Morrow Counties.
