

Sheriff's Report

The Morrow County Sheriff's Office reports handling the following business:

June 26: -MCSO received a request for extra patrol in **Scholarships** available for **local businesses**

Anyone running a business these days knows how hard it is to make the business successful and profitable. Now there is some help for local business people who want to learn more about how to make their small business more successful.

The Willow Creek Economic Development Group is teaming up with The BMCC Small Business Development Center (SBDC) and the Bank of Eastern Oregon to offer financial help for businesses who want to enroll in a program to help with problems like record keeping, marketing and personnel management.

SBDC offers the one year program for \$660, but through a special arrangement SBDC has reduced the cost of the program to just \$425 for the nine seminars. Local businesses will not have to pay the entire cost however, because WC-VEDG is offering small business scholarships of \$150 and the Bank of Eastern Oregon is kicking in another \$150 to make the total cost to the business person just \$125 for one year of programs, including "the need for good records", "requirements of a good system", "methods of accounting", "how to analyze your records" and "business planning".

Doug Lamberson is the instructor for the course, and he has a BA in business administration and master's in economics. He has owned two successful businesses and has eight years experience working for the Small Business Development Center. Lamberson has also taught a wide variety of seminars.

The management program is designed for established businesses which have been operating for at least one year, and offers monthly evening workshops and individual monthly on-site business visits during the period of October through June. Several Heppner businesses have already taken the program and report good benefit from it.
