 High School and chaperones are also planning a trip to the convention. HHS Principal Daye Stone, who will attend as a chaperone, along with FFA advisor Beth Dickenson, said that he attended the convention as a high school student and had nothing but praise for the experience. He said that Dickenson had arranged for several special tours for the students, including a visit to her family's farming operation in Iowa.

-approved modifications to the district's alcohol/drug violation policy for students involved in athletic and other school programs. The updates will make the consequences for students' subsequent drug/alcohol violations more in line with the intended policy. Consequences for subsequent violations will become progressively more severe, rather than more lenient, as per previous policy. Burrows and principals said that students and their parents will be informed of the policy changes via school handbooks, meetings with coaches and information sent home.

-received a report from Lea Mathieu, a Boardman teacher, who has been on a year-long sabbatical to Mexico. Mathieu said that she would now feel comfortable conducting a basic parent-teacher conference in Spanish. "It was a wonderful experience," she said. "We'll see throughout the year how it works," said board member Berto Hernandez. "Put it to work," he told Mathieu.

-adopted the 2007-08 Morrow County School District Board goals.

-heard from Burrows that teacher training in use of new document cameras will be held later this month. The district received 27 cameras, which can project virtually any object or reading material onto a screen to facilitate teaching. The ESD funded 50 percent of the cost of the equipment.

-learned from board member Barney Lindsay that he may be willing to fill the vacancy on the ESD Budget Committee. Board Chair Craig Miles previ-

ously filled that seat. -discussed the possibility of using biodegradable cafeteria plates in district schools, rather than the current Styrofoam plates. It was reported that cardboard plates cost three times over the cost of Styrofoam. Another possibility was edible/biodegradable plates made from corn. The district plans to investigate the issue.
