Alfred D. Hensley of Irrigon died Aug. 10, 2007, at Walla Walla Veterans Administration Medical Center. He was 79.

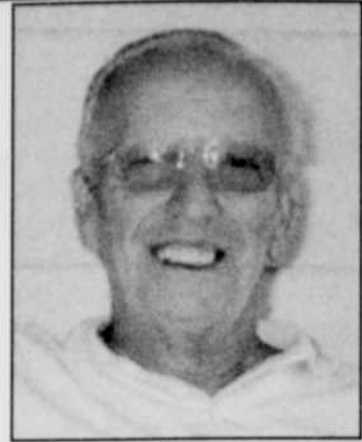
A memorial service was held at 1 p.m. Wednesday, August 15, at Columbia View Community Church in Irrigon.

ESD to conduct hearing screenings

The Umatilla-Morrow Education Service District (ESD) will be providing hearing screening to public elementary school students including all kindergarten, first and third grade students, new students to the county and parent/teacher/principal referrals of students in the other grades. These students will be screened on the dates listed.

The hearing screening is done by the Umatilla-Morrow ESD for public school students of Umatilla and Morrow Counties. It is cooperatively sponsored by local school districts. Approximately 4000 children will be seen. Children who fail the initial screening will be re-screened within a three week period.
