Mustangs roll past Outlaws, 46-0

The Heppner Mustangs jumped out to a quick lead and never let up in downing the visiting Enterprise Outlaws 46-0 on Senior Night, Friday, October 26, in Blue Mountain Conference play.

The game started out as a fumble-fest as Sam King recovered an Outlaw fumble on their first possession, but the Mustangs returned the favor by putting the ball on the ground. Taylor Hodges picked up a loose ball and took it back for a touchdown that was nullified by a penalty. But the defense held, forcing a punt with the Mustangs taking over at the Enterprise 48 yard line.

Lane Bailey broke free for 29 yards on first down with Brent Eckman going for 17 yards. After a short gain by Bailey, Eckman took it in from five yards out. The kick was no good but the Mustangs led 6-0.

On the Outlaws' next possession, Jordan Hatfield picked off a pass and brought it back to the Outlaws' 48 yard line. Eckman then hit King in stride who took it all the way for a touchdown. Josh Shank kicked the extra point to make it 13-0 midway through the first quarter.

On the Outlaws' next possession, they coughed up the ball again with Hodges recovering it at the Enterprise 42 yard line. Bailey ran twice for 15 yards, Spencer Palmer ran twice for 18 yards and after a motion penalty, Bailey went for 12 more and a first down at the seven. Bailey went for two and then took it in from five yards out to make it 19-0 late in the first quarter.

The defense held again and the Mustangs took over at the Enterprise 32 yard line after a short punt. Eckman ran twice for 23 yards and Bailey went for two and then took it in from the seven. After Josh Shank's kick, the Mustangs led 26-0 early in the second quarter.

On the Outlaws next possession, Nacho Elguezabal recovered a fumble at the Enterprise 31. Palmer took a lateral pass for six yards and Bailey ran twice for 18 yards to the seven yard line but the drive stalled and the Outlaws took over on downs at their own six.

The defense held and the Mustangs took over at the Enterprise 16 after a three yard punt. Eckman hit king on first down in the endzone for a touchdown. The kick was blocked but the Mustangs held a 32-0 lead with 4:28 left in the first half.

On the Outlaws next possession, Jake VanDoorn made a hit, knocking the ball loose that King jumped on at the Enterprise 45 yard line. Eckman hit Palmer for four yards. Willy Gentry then came in and hit Hatfield for a 41 yard touchdown. Shank kicked the extra point to make it 39-0 late in the second quarter.

The Mustangs got the ball back one more time and almost scored again. Bailey took a 17 yard pass from Eckman and then broke free for 40 yards to the five as the half ended.

The Outlaws converted an onside kick to open the second half but the defense held and the Mustangs took over at their 37 yard line after a punt. Bailey broke free for 34 yards and after a delay of game penalty he ran twice more for 19 yards and a first down at the 16 yard line. After an incomplete pass and an illegal motion penalty, Gentry hit Dennis Kenny for 13 yards and Eckman ran for five yards and a first down at the three. Two incomplete passes and a defensive penalty later, Bailey took in from two yards out for the touchdown. Shank kicked the extra point to make it 46-0 with 7:49 left in the third and led to a running clock the rest of the way due to the 45-point rule.

On the Outlaws next possession, Dalton Wellman ended their drive with an interception at the Mustangs' 10 yard line as the third

quarter came to an end.

The teams traded possessions throughout the fourth quarter with neither team threatening to score.

Bailey rushed 19 times for 192 yards with Eckman rushing five times for 49 yards.

Eckman hit 4 of 10 passes for 85 yards and two touchdowns, both to King for 64 total yards. Gentry was 2 for 6 for 54 yards and one touchdown.

The defense held the Outlaws to 92 yards total and were led by King with 23 defensive points all in the first half. King sat out the second half with a sore calf muscle. Andre Rauch and Wacy Coil each had 17 points, Hodges had 16 points, VanDoorn and Wellman each had 15 points, Elguezabal had 14 points, and Hatfield had 13 points.

County and cities to meet Friday over 'tippage' fees

courthouse.

Boardman Mayor Ed Glenn said Monday he believes the cities would like to work the issue out without having it on the ballot. "Our preference would be an intergovernmental agreement instead of an ordinance," Glenn said.

He also said that the cities' position is the same now and that they should receive a more equitable distribution of the money. "We do feel the cities deserve more of the money. We don't think such a large amount of the money should be used to backfill the county budget."

Glenn criticized the way the county now distributes some of the tippage money through a county wide committee using the needs and issue process. "The distribution is not always equal," he pointed out. "Some of the money is even going back to the county." He said local communities would better be able to know the people's needs that the committee. "We are closer to the people," he said. "Each city has different needs and situations that are not recognized by the county."

Glenn, who represented the cities' position during the last meeting with the county court, will once again assume that role, he said.

"Our hope is we can work out an agreeable situation that will satisfy the needs of cities without destroying the county," Glenn said. Morrow County Judge Terry Tallman said Tuesday he hopes the two sides can work things out. "I don't want this to be decisive," Tallman said. He did say he "had a little trouble" with the cities' demand that they get 75 percent and county gets 25.

Tallman said he hopes the meeting is productive, but also said he was not "afraid of a vote" on the issue.

Tallman also pointed out that needs and issues allocation of tippage fees went from \$132,839 in 2006 to about \$235,000 in 2007. The money is allocated to various groups and government entities by a committee of people from throughout the county.

About the meeting Friday, Tallman said it is a public meeting and if someone from the public want to speak they will be welcome to do so.
