Sheriff's Report

The Morrow County Sheriff's Office reports handling the following business:

NET "WALK-AWAY" CASH

How much cash will you walk away with from the sale of your home? I can help you arrive at this figure. During your listing appointment, I will help you set a selling price for your home. 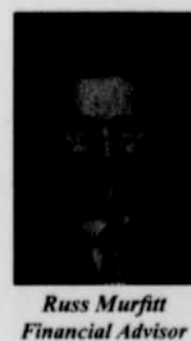
