

Sheriff's Report

The Morrow County Sheriff's Office reports handling the following business:

Nov. 12: -MCSO arrested David Escareno Ramirez, 25, on a Hermiston Municipal Court Warrant for Failure to Pay Fine/DUII, DWO, Driving Uninsured, Menacing, Carry a Concealed Weapon and Possession of Marijuana.
