**DA's Report**

Morrow County District Attorney Elizabeth Ballard has released the following report:

-Osvaldo Navarro-Landeros, 23, was convicted on assault in the fourth degree, a class A misdemeanor and was sentenced to 180 days in jail with 180 days suspended, two year bench probations, complete 40 hours of community service, other numerous conditions, and pay \$1,413 in fines, fees, and assessments.

-Darwin David Smith, 20, was convicted of sexual abuse in the third degree, a class A misdemeanor and was sentenced to 180 days in jail with 180 days suspended, two year bench probation, complete 40 hours of community service, other numerous conditions, and pay \$913 in fines, fees and assessments.

-Darwin David Smith, 20, was convicted of burglary in the second degree, a class C felony and was sentenced to 18 months supervised probation, 90 sanction units with 30 jail units, complete 80 hours of community service, enroll in and complete social re-education/life skills training program, other numerous conditions, and pay \$1,923 in fines, fees and assessments.

-Daniel Allan Macomber, 36, was convicted of failure to report as a sex offender, a class A misdemeanor and was sentenced to 180 days in jail with 180 days suspended, two year bench probation, complete 40 hours of community service, register as a sex offender, other numerous conditions, and pay \$638 in fines, fees and assessments.

Glenn Duane Spivey, a Prineville resident passed away on Friday, February 8, 2008. He was 73 years old.

Glenn was born in Baker City on June 18, 1934 to Luther A. and Ora Lee (Ellis) Spivey. He attended high school and graduated in the first graduating class at the new High school in 1952.

Glenn enlisted and served in the U.S. Army from 1957 to 1959. He married Connie Nelson in Spray on June 30, 1962. Glenn worked for the Kinzua Corp. in Kinzua from 1952 until they closed the mill in 1978. He worked as a choker setter and was the lead man in the factory at Kinzua. They moved to Prineville in 1978 from Kinzua. In Prineville he worked at the Hudspeth mill where he pulled green chain, and then he worked at Clear Pine Moldings as a lead man in the Wood Chipper operations, retiring in 1997. In 1980 Glenn was awarded a first place Lumber Grader certificate for the highest score from Western Wood Products Association - Warm Springs.

He was a past member of Condon Elks Lodge, Oehoco Bow Hunters Association and the Lumber Graders Association.

He enjoyed doing word search puzzles, competing in 3-D and target tournaments, Steelhead fishing on the Wallowa and John Day Rivers, reading, bowling in the leagues in Condon and Prineville, camping, watching the Trailblazers and visiting with friends. He had a great sense of humor and was quite the prankster. His grandchildren were his number one love.

Glenn is survived by: his wife Connie of Prineville; son, Brian and his wife Stefanie of Heppner; daughter, Penny and her husband Patrick Hughes of Madras; brothers, Clyde, Claude and Henry Spivey all of Baker City and Roy Spivey of Salem; sisters, Blanche Pearce of Durkee,

**Heppner PTC to host family event**

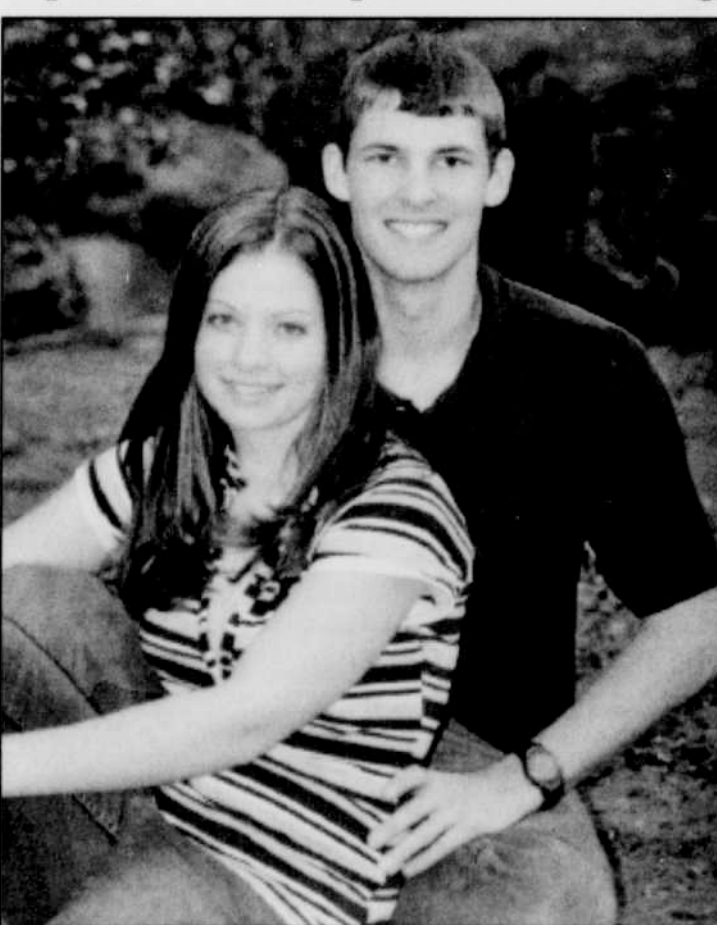
The Parent-Teacher Club in Heppner will be hosting "Step Out With the Family" for K-6 graders and their families on March 7 from 6-9 p.m.
