eBay entrepreneur workshop offered at Heppner

A one-day "Become an eBay Entrepreneur" workshop will be offered in Heppner for area residents and business owners by the nonprofit Libraries of Eastern Oregon (LEO) on Saturday, April 19. The workshop is open to anyone who is interested in on-line buying and selling for personal or business needs or in setting up an eBay income stream.

The workshop is provided through grant funding from USDA Rural Development to LEO for small business development in the region. It will be held at the Heppner Public Library, 444 N. Main St., from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. and is hosted by the Oregon Trail Library District.

Designed to overcome apprehension about buying and selling on-line, the class will prepare participants to become smart shoppers and successful sellers on the Internet. The focus will be on eBay, by far the largest venue for buying and selling a wide variety of items from all over the world on-line. The workshop will consist of two four-hour sessions, starting at 8 a.m. and concluding at 5 p.m. with a one-hour lunch break.

Tuition for the course is \$45 per person or \$75 for two persons from the same household, business or organization. Instructor for the class is Bob Jones of Milton-Freewater. Jones has been buying and selling on eBay for nine years, dealing with customers and vendors in 49 states and 20 foreign

countries. Based on his experiences, the class will start with the basics of registering with eBay and understanding how its auctions work and will move up to a higher skills level. There will be tips on finding bargains, avoiding rip-offs, and resolving problems. A step-by-step demonstration will show how to create an actual eBay auction.

Options for payment and shipping, as well as techniques for giving and receiving great customer service also will be covered.

"Whether you know next to nothing about eBay, or know something but want to know more, want to have active eBay income sideline or just sell a few items, this class should prove helpful," Jones said.

The workshop has been brought to several Eastern Oregon communities by LEO due to popular demand. Enrollment is now open, and will be offered on a first-come, first-served basis as seating is limited. Registration is in advance at the Heppner library and, if space allows, also at the workshop. Registration forms are available at the library.

Forest Service recruits youth for YCC

Four young people between the ages of 15 and 18 are being recruited by the Forest Service, Heppner Ranger District, for summer employment in the Youth Conservation Corps. The work may include noxious weed removal, fisheries and wildlife habitat improvement, slash piling, and trail and campground maintenance.

The duration of the program will be eight weeks from June 23 through August 15. The will be the Oregon minimum wage of \$7.95 per hour. Applications will be accepted through April 15 until 2 p.m. Participants will be selected on a random basis on April 15 at 4 p.m.

No previous experience is required. Applicants must be 15 years old and not reach age 19 during the term of employment in the program, and have a social security number or have made application to obtain one. Applicants must also obtain parental or legal guardian consent to enroll in the program.
