

Sheriff's Report

The Morrow County Sheriff's Office reports handling the following business: **April 3 cont.:** -Boardman Police Dept. officer arrested Frank Edward Plumb, 47, for Criminal Trespass II. He was lodged at the Umatilla County Jail.

-Boardman Police Dept. received a report from a caller in Boardman that her car has been missing for six months and she would like information on what could have possibly happened to the car. The caller thought it might have been towed or stolen.

-Boardman Fire Dept. received a relayed report of a fire on Tower Road. It was determined to be a small circle on fire that burned itself out. The call was cancelled.

DOWN PAYMENT AFFECTS LOAN

The size of the down payment can directly affect the buyer's borrowing power. If the loan is being made by a bank that will sell the mortgage on the secondary market to Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac, the borrower who puts 20 percent down will usually be allowed to devote up to 28 percent of gross, pre-tax, monthly income toward housing expenses. Borrowers with 10 percent down can usually put just 25 percent of gross income toward housing expenses.

Buyers who can't meet these debt ratios have some options. First, they can seek out a bank that will keep its loan on its books instead of selling it to Fannie Mae or Freddie Mac. Their rate may be slightly higher, but they have a little more leeway in their debt ratios. Also, buyers who can't meet the standard debt ratios may be attracted to an adjustable rate mortgage. Its lower introductory rate may make it easier to qualify for a loan or allow the borrower to get a bigger loan and nicer home.
