Jepsen is the primary computer programmer/developer for engineering outreach, the graduate distance-education arm of the College of Engineering. He was nominated by his co-workers and supervisor

for the award - which included a plaque and check for \$500.

Jepsen designs web applications for students, staff and faculty. These programs include creating a new internal database, video-on-demand viewing, a download interface for students, and a grade and homework tracking system for faculty. This past year he put together servers to

deliver thousands of course videos online as an alternative to mailing DVDs. He had to design and write the software for all of this to happen.

Jepsen is the son of Bill and Nancy Jepsen of Heppner. He and his wife and two children live in Moscow, ID. Matt graduated from U of I in 2003, and he has been working for the college ever since.
