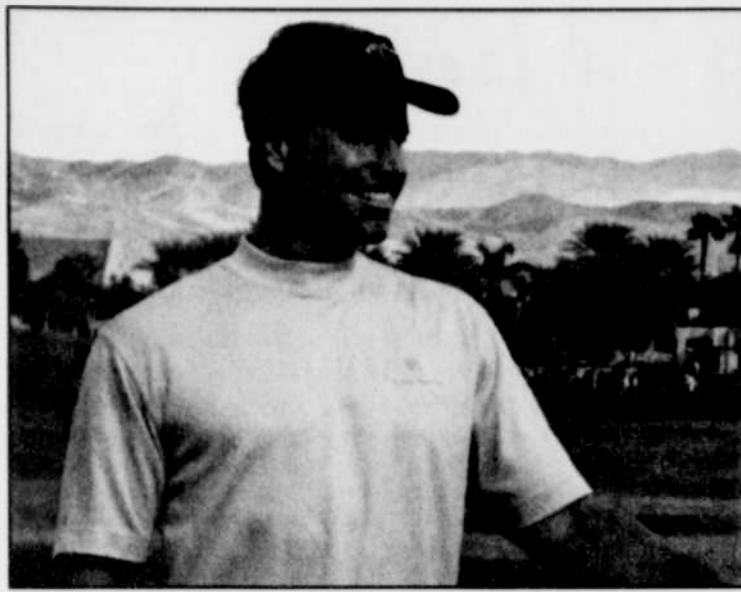


## Golf pro to hold clinics at WCCC
