Heppner area writers of all ages invited to library "Read Aloud"

A special "Read Aloud" program will be held in for area writers of all ages and skill levels at the Heppner branch library on Mon., June 16.

Those attending will be invited to read aloud from their own works or from works by their favorite authors. The programs are open to anyone who would like to read aloud or to just come and listen. Persons of all ages and skills levels are encouraged to participate. The Read Aloud program will be held at 7 p.m. and is hosted by Libraries of Eastern Oregon (LEO) and Oregon Trail Library District. LEO executive director Lyn Craig will facilitate readings by those present.

The program is one of nine Read Aloud events in the region, sponsored by LEO with funding assistance provided by the Oregon Cultural Trust.

There is no advance registration for those who would like to attend and read from their works. The amount of time allocated for each presenter will depend on how many come to read and will be generally from five to 10 minutes for each.

A published anthology of works written by area writers is planned by LEO for later this year in conjunction with Eastern Oregon Writers Guild members. Anyone interested in submitting works for consideration for the anthology may send them to Jo Cowling, LEO Chair, Cook Memorial Library, 2006 Fourth Ave., LaGrande OR 97850. Selections will be made this fall.

"We hope to have a good turnout as it's so interesting to hear what others have written," said Marsha Richmond, library district director. "It's going to be a fun evening and a way to promote creative writing here in the community."
