fundraiser during the Celebrate Heppner festivities at the Heppner City Park this Friday beginning at 6 p.m. There will be two judging categories-Adults and Juniors up to 16 years old. Cash prizes will be given to the top three desserts selected by a panel of judges. Criteria for judging includes: appearance-45 points; taste/flavor-45 points; and texture-10 points.

Pie Plate Pie Crust by Peggy Fishburn

For an 8-inch pie: 1-1/2 cups flour
1-1/2 Tablespoons sugar
1 scant teaspoon salt
1/2 cup oil

2 Tablespoons milk
For a 9-inch pie: 2 cups flour
2 Tablespoons sugar
1 teaspoon salt
2/3 cup oil
3 Tablespoons milk

Measure ingredients into a pie plate. Using a fork, mix ingredients until all are mixed. Using hands, press dough around sides and bottom of pie pan. Add filling to pie shell and bake as usual. If desired, reserve a scant 1/4 of dough mixture, add 3-4 Tablespoons flaked coconut. Mix and crumble on top of pie. (Especially good for peach, berry or apple pies.) If for a cream pie, bake pie shell at 350 degrees for 15-20 minutes or until pie shell is golden brown. This is also a good pie crust for quiche.

Boardman Council adopts 2008-09 budget

The Boardman City Council, during their June 3 meeting, adopted the 2008-2009 fiscal year budget of \$6,038,200.00, according to a city of Boardman news release. Property taxes will be levied at a rate of \$4.2114 per \$1000 of assessed valuation and \$425,000 will be levied for bonded indebtedness not subject to Measure 5 or Measure 50 limitations, said the release.

The city's finance director, Tom Kligel said, "Although the 2008-09 budget is tight, the city is braced for development, and will be able to do projects as necessary."

In other city business, councilors heard a presentation from Sanitary Disposal regarding an increase in garbage rates. Councilors will address the garbage rates during their next regular meeting.

NOTICE TO THE PUBLIC OF INTENT TO REHABILITATE AFFORDABLE HOUSING INVOLVING FLOODPLAIN IN HEPPNER, OREGON

Federal funds will be used to assist in the rehabilitation of 19 units of affordable rental housing at St. Patrick's Senior Apartments, 190 N. Main Street, Heppner, Oregon. This building was formerly known as the Heppner Hotel and is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. The proposed work includes repair and upgrading of interior finishes, replacement of windows, exterior painting, and other related work to maintain the integrity of the building. There will be no change to the building size or footprint.

Executive Order 11988 requires a determination of the practicability of alternatives to having a project in a flood area. To make this determination, the following factors were analyzed: (1) the natural environment including topography, habitat, hazards; (2) social concerns including aesthetics, historical and cultural values, land use patterns; (3) economic aspects such as costs of space, construction, services, and relocations; (4) legal constraints including deeds and leases; (5) modification of design; (6) practicable alternatives; and (7) measures of mitigation.

THE MORROW COUNTY PLANNING COMMISSION will hold the following hearing of public interest on Tuesday, June 24th, at 7:00 p.m. at the North Morrow County Annex Building in Irrigon, Oregon.

Continued from May 20, 2008, Land Partition LP-S-390 and Conditional Use Permit CUP-S-257: James and Susanne Wychules, applicants, and Donald O. Robinson Family Trust and Merlyn A. Robinson Family Trust, owners. Property is described as tax lot 3700 of Assessor's Map 2S 26. The property is zoned Exclusive Farm Use (EFU) and is located east of Heppner just south of Highway 74 along the eastern line of the Heppner Urban Growth Boundary. Request is to partition a 1076-acre parcel to create two "non-farm" dwelling parcels and to allow the siting of two "non-farm" dwellings. Criteria for approval include the Morrow County Zoning Ordinance Article 3 Section 3.010; Article 6 Sections 6.020 and 6.030; and the Morrow County Subdivision Ordinance Article 5 Land Partitioning.

Opportunity to voice support or opposition to the above proposals or to ask questions will be provided. Failure to raise an issue in person or by letter or failure to provide sufficient specificity to afford the decision maker an opportunity to respond to the issue precludes appeal to the Land Use Board of Appeals based on those issues.
