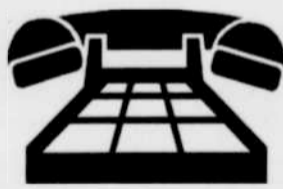

**Update for four year old cancer patient**

Cooper Larson, 4, was diagnosed 10 months ago with a rare brainstem cancer. His family recently found out that his tumor has grown four millimeters

appeared to be smaller than normal and didn't know if they would actually fit the players. "We got 'em," said McElligott. "Let's use them." Hot debate prompted a brief argument between board member Joe McElligott who questioned Morte's absence from a meeting. She fired back, "You don't need my opinion," and abruptly exited the meeting.

-briefly discussed the immediate need for a determination of the scope and monetary amount of the proposed bond issue. The board scheduled two workshops-a planning meeting for August 5 and a bond levy meeting for August 11, both at 5 p.m. at the school.

-approved hiring of Becky Wagenblast as a high school teacher.

-approved various housekeeping chores, such as naming chief financial officer/business manager, custodian of funds, etc. The board approved a change in legal counsel to Doug Hojem from previous counsel John Osburn and updated the travel reimbursement rate to the IRS rate as stipulated in their by-laws. The rate for authorized travel was changed from .505 cents per mile, the Umatilla-Morrow ESD rate, to the IRS rate of .585 cents per mile. Meal reimbursement is set at \$6 for breakfast, \$9 for lunch and \$20 for dinner

for a maximum of \$35.

-elected board member John Rietmann as board chair for 2008-09, replacing Joel Peterson.

-elected board member Joe McElligott as vice-chair.

-appointed Joe McElligott and Bink Ramos to serve on the building and grounds committee.

-approved a \$500 expenditure so that the new superintendent can attend several professional development workshops.

-approved hiring the following coaches: Mike Garrett- girls' high school basketball head coach; Brian Spivey-boys' middle school head boys' basketball coach; Dawn Eynetich-head high school volleyball coach; Dale Holland- high school assistant football coach; and Deacon Heideman-high school/middle school assistant football coach.

-held an executive session for the purpose of labor negotiations and performance evaluations.

-learned that Ione High School was third in the Oregonian Cup. The state-wide award is based on academics, athletics and sportsmanship.

-learned that the next regular board meeting is set for Monday, August 18; and the Oregon School Board Association annual conference is planned November 14-16 in Portland.
