

Ione boys take second win of season against Riverside, Lady Cards lose

The Ione boys got their second win of the season in impressive fashion, defeating Riverside in Boardman on Monday, December 22.

With no practice since the previous Tuesday, fans might have expected a sloppy effort from both teams but the Cards took the court looking sharp. Ione jumped out to a 15-12 first quarter advantage with several of the buckets coming off the fast break. Early in the second, the Cardinals ran off an 11-1 run to build up a 13 point lead. Riverside wasn't about to give in though, cutting the lead to five at the half, 28-23. There was no letup in the third as Ione outscored the Pirates 20-9, led by eight points from both Zac Orem and Matt Hams. The Cards scored the first six points of the fourth quarter to build their biggest lead of the day, 22 points before hammering home the 64-49 win.

Sizzling hot shooting and good defense was the story of the game for Ione. Overall, the Cards shot 54% from the field and equaled that percentage from outside the three point line. The Cards shot over 60% in the first and third quarters.

Matt Hams led all scorers with 21 points including three three-pointers. Zac Orem continued to contribute in a big way with 18 points including three threes of his own. Cory Peterson was also in double figures with 10.

Ione battled to a 35-27 rebounding edge led by Clay Morter with 13 boards. Matt Hams added six and

Zac Orem and Alex Fetterhoff each had five. The Cardinals had 21 assists to just eight for the Pirates led by Clay Morter with five and Cory Peterson with four. Cory Peterson also led the team with six steals. Matt Hams had four blocks.

Coach Dennis Stefani was pleasantly surprised by the outing after a week of missed practices due to snow. "The team moved the ball well, doing a great job of keeping the floor spread allowing cutting lanes to open towards the basket. But most of all I liked seeing, the start of us getting the ball inside to the posts, something I think we have struggled with" he said. "Also I felt we played a very good complete defensive game. We not only put great pressure on them, but when the shot went up we did a terrific job of screening out and controlling the boards."

The Cardinals will host a snow-delayed game against Dufur on Friday and travel to Stanfield on Saturday.

Lady Cards

The Lady Cardinals hung close to Riverside in the first half, trailing just 10-11 at the break but an ice cold second half was the story of the game as they lost to the Lady Pirates 44-17. In the first half, both teams looked like they had not practiced in almost a week but Riverside was able to get their offense moving and scoring in the second.

Stefanie Archer led the Lady Cards in scoring with seven points. Tiana Camarillo added four.
