

Heppner girls' team brings home 1st place trophy

The Heppner Mustang track team competed in the Umatilla/Heppner Invitational on Saturday, April 11, and the girls' team came away with a first place team trophy. The boys' team earned sixth place.

The girls earned 115.5 points on their way to the team title.

Erin Price won three individual events by crossing the line first in the 100-meter hurdles, 300-meter dash. She also ran a leg on the first place 4x400-meter relay team. Brynna Rust, Catherine McElligott, and Frida Arevik also ran on the

winning relay. Rust finished second in the 300-meter hurdles, third in the 100-meter hurdles, and fourth in the 100-meter dash. McElligott earned third place in the 800-meters, and Arevik finished fourth in the 200-meter dash. Carrie Hague-wood had her best jump of the year in the high jump and finished second. Vivian Thompson and Carmen Lee had a good day in the jumps, with Thompson getting third in the triple jump and Lee getting second in the long jump. JoAnna Patton also had a season best mark in the high jump and in the 400-meter dash and finished

third in the high jump and seventh in the 400.

Jordan Hatfield was the only first place finisher for the boys' team, but there were many personal bests set. Hatfield finished first in the 110-meter hurdles. He also finished second in the triple jump and the 300-meter hurdles and ran on the second place 4x100-meter relay team.

Alex Pickles also ran on the relay team, and he had his best long jump of the season and finished fourth in the event. Bryan Holland ran on the relay and finished fourth in the 400-meter dash. Spencer Palmer ran

his season best time in the 800-meters and finished in fourth place. In the throws, Jordan Wright and Mark McCabe finished sixth and eighth in the shot put.

Mustangs win 10 events at Echo Invitational

The Heppner High School track team competed with 12 other teams at the Echo Invitational Tuesday, April 7, and had their most successful meet of the season. The girls' team finished in second place - only five points behind first place, and the boys' team finished in fourth place.

Many athletes set new season bests on a day that was ideal for good marks. The girls finished first in eight events on their way to 163 team points.

Erin Price (800M, 100M hurdles) and Brynna Rust (300M hurdles and 100M) each had two first place finishes. Frida Arevik (200M), Carrie Hague-wood (high jump), and Catherine McElligott (1500M) also gained titles in events. The 4x100 meter relay team (McElligott, Price, Arevik, Kelsi Putman) and the 4x400 relay team (McElligott, Price, Rust, Arevik) also crossed the line in first place. Other scorers for the girls were JoAnna Patton (2nd - high jump, 3rd - 400M,

7th - triple jump), Keshawna Talamantes (2nd - shot put, 2nd - discus, 3rd - javelin), Putman (7th - 200M), Jodessa Chapa (4th - 300M), Rust (2nd - 100M hurdles), Vivian Thompson (4th - 300M hurdles), Hague-wood (4th - triple jump), and Marlen Weise (5th - high jump).

The boys' team scored 84 points while finishing in fourth.

Jordan Hatfield (110M hurdles) and Bryan Holland (400M) won individual events. Both relays (4x100 - Quinn Chick, Holland, Hatfield, Alex Pickles; 4x400 - Chick, Matt Holland, Hatfield, Spencer Palmer) finished second. Other scorers for the boys were Chick (6th - 200M, 8th - 100M), B. Holland (3rd - 800M), Seth Palmer (7th - 1500M), Eric Vogel (3rd - 3000M), Andrew Bara (7th - 110M hurdles), Jordan Wright (7th - shot put, 4th - javelin), Michael Hawks (8th - discus), Mark McCabe (5th - shot put), Pickles (4th - long jump), and Hatfield (2nd - triple jump).
