Where do you go if you think your hearing has declined? What kind of assisted care living facilities are available in our area? What services do Home Health and Hospice provide? Should I have a living will or power of attorney or estate planning? Is there a test for Alzheimer's? Is my blood pressure too high? What kinds of insur-

ance are available to senior citizens? Who can help me with new weatherization on my home? What kind of information does the Morrow County Veteran's Officer provide? If I need assistance purchasing food, is there a local resource? If I need a new smoke alarm, is there someone local who can help me? What is a reverse mortgage, and is it available locally? With over 30 businesses and services signed up to attend the information fair, all your questions will be answered by the professionals.

In the three side rooms, there will be ongoing short presentations from the health professionals. Most of the presenters

will offer brochures and pamphlets, and also some snacks and free promotional items. There are door prizes every half hour, including a Schwan's Food gift certificate, a planter bowl from Westwinds Nursery, two free dinners from Macario's Restaurant (new to Boardman), T-shirts, gift baskets and much more.

Boardman Senior Center also plans to offer a dinner for \$6 which will include pulled pork sandwiches, potato salad, dessert and beverage.

Admission to the information fair is free, however a donation of a nonperishable food item which will go to the local food bank, is appreciated.
