

## Sheriff's Report

The Morrow County Sheriff's Office reports handling the following business:

**March 2 cont:** -MCSO was notified that Umatilla County had arrested Scott Alan Maker, 20, on Morrow County Circuit Court warrant for probation violation.

-BPD arrested Osvaldo Landeros Navarro, 24, on a Morrow County Circuit Court warrant for Failure to Appear/Assault IV.

### CHOICE - VARIABLE OR FIXED LOAN

If you plan to buy a home in the near future, should you select a variable or a fixed loan? Actually, this should be a last-minute decision, not made until a home is actually selected. The financing market changes often enough so that the best financing mode one month may not be the best the next month. Most experts consider the length of time the mortgage will be in effect as the primary factor when choosing between a fixed and variable mortgage.

If you expect to live in the house for a long time and you feel that interest rates will increase, you may lean toward the stability of a fixed rate, especially if the spread between the two rates is fairly close. If you don't expect to live in the home for a very long time, the variable rate mortgage would be the answer.

Also, since the variable rate mortgage carries a lower initial rate, thus lowering the income qualification for a loan, this may be the only alternative for certain buyers.
