

Orange Kist Coconut Cream Pie – Phyllis Piper (Honorable Mention Adult Division)

1 nine-inch baked pie shell
Filling
 1c. sugar
 3T cornstarch
 1c water
 1/4c orange juice
 1/4c butter
 1T grated orange peel
 3 egg yolks
 1/2c coconut toasted
 1/2c Dairy sour cream
 1/2c whipping cream, whipped
Topping
 1/2c whipping cream
 2T powdered sugar
 1/4c coconut, toasted
 2T sliced almonds, toasted
 In medium sauce pan combine

sugar and cornstarch; mix well. Stir in water, orange juice, butter, orange peel and egg yolks. Cook over medium heat about five minutes or until mixture thickens and boils, stirring constantly. Cover surface with plastic wrap. Refrigerate until just cool, about 1 hour. Stir in toasted coconut and sour cream. Spoon into pie shell. In same bowl, beat 1/2 whipping cream and powdered sugar until stiff peaks form. Spread over filling. Garnish with 1/4c toasted coconut and almonds. Chill 1-2 hours.

Chocolate, Pudding Cake - Melissa Jo Monaco (3rd Place Adult Division)

Ingredients
 1 1/2 c butter (no substitutes)
 12 squares bittersweet chocolate (I used unsweetened.)
 2 1/4 c sugar
 3 eggs
 2 c strong brewed coffee
 2 t rum extract
 1 1/2 t vanilla extract
 3 cups all-purpose flour
 1 1/2 t baking soda
 3/4 t salt
Directions
 Melt butter and chocolate together. Beat in sugar. Add eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition. Beat in coffee and extracts. Combine flour, baking soda and salt; gradually add to the chocolate mixture.
Additions made to the recipe:
 1/2 c apricot preserves
 1/2 c strawberry preserves
 1/2 c coconut
 1/2 c slivered almonds
 11.5 oz package milk chocolate chips

Grease and flour 10 inch fluted tube pan. Pour 1/3 batter into pan. Spoon apricot preserves onto batter and sprinkle with slivered almonds. Add another 1/3 batter. Spoon strawberry preserves onto batter and sprinkle with coconut. Add remaining batter. Bake at 325 degrees for 55 to 65 minutes or until toothpick inserted near center, comes out clean. Cool for 10 minutes before inverting onto a wire rack to cool completely. When cake is completely cool, spoon melted chocolate chips over top, allowing to run over the sides. Caution: It was difficult getting the cake out of the pan because the top layer was so moist. Also, with the addition of the preserves, almonds and coconut, there is more batter than needed, and in the baking process, it came up above the top.

Lemon Cloud Pie – Phyllis Piper (2nd Place Adult Division)

1 nine-inch baked pie shell
Filling
 1c. sugar
 3T cornstarch
 1c. water
 1/3c lemon juice
 2 egg yolks, slightly beaten
 4oz. cream cheese, cubed, softened
 1-2T grated lemon peel
 1/2c whipping cream
Topping
 1/2c whipping cream
Directions
 In medium sauce pan combine sugar and cornstarch; mix well. Stir in water, lemon juice, and

egg yolks. Cook over medium heat until mixture thickens and boils, stirring constantly. Boil 1 minute. Add cream cheese and lemon peel, stirring until cream cheese is melted and mixture is smooth. Cool to room temperature. Beat 1/2c whipping cream until soft peaks form; fold into lemon mixture. Spoon filling mixture evenly into baked pie shell. Cover surface with plastic wrap. Chill 6-8 hours or overnight. Spoon or pipe whipped cream over filling.
