New FSA Livestock Indemnity Program announced

Eligible ranchers and livestock producers can begin applying for benefits through the Livestock Indemnity Program. This assistance program is contained in the 2008 Farm Bill.

The Livestock Indemnity Program (LIP) provides financial assistance to producers for livestock deaths that result from natural disaster. LIP compensates livestock owners and contract growers for livestock death losses in excess of normal mortality due to adverse weather, including losses due to hurricanes, floods, blizzards, certain diseases, wildfires, extreme heat and extreme cold. Eligible losses must have occurred on or after January 1, 2008, and before October 1, 2011. Note that

drought is not a qualifying event.

Specific provisions for the other supplemental agricultural disaster assistance programs authorized by the 2008 Act will be implemented through separate rulemakings and announced at a later date. These assistance programs include the Livestock Forage Disaster Program (LFP), the Supplemental Revenue Assistance Program (SURE), the Emergency Assistance for Livestock, Honey Bees, and Farm-Raised Fish (ELAP) and the Tree Assistance Program (TAP).
