-Boardman Police Department officer picked up a long-haired Chihuahua in Boardman and transported it to Pet Rescue.

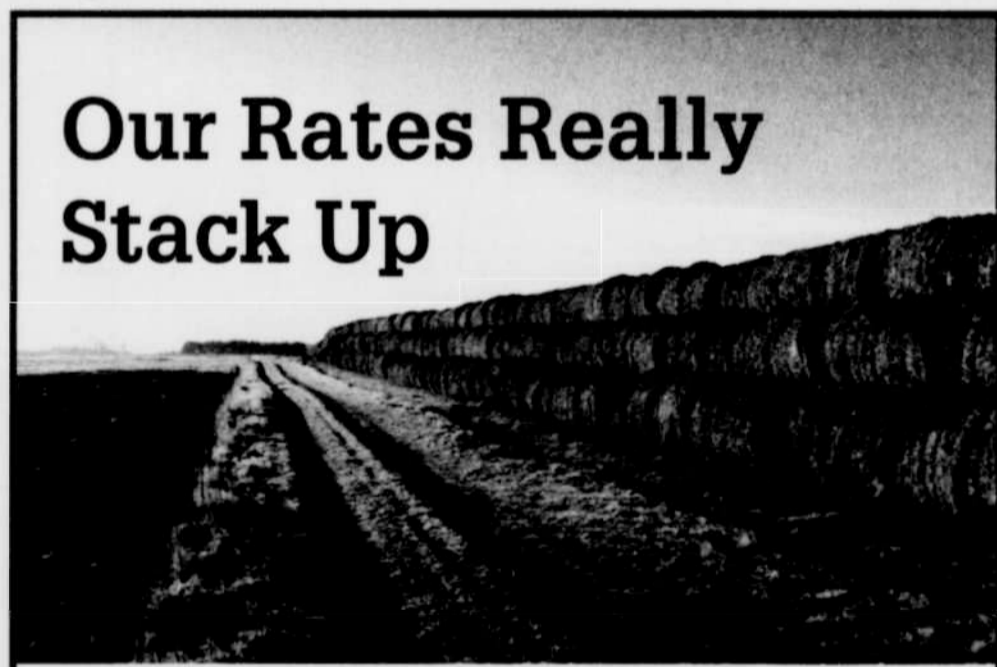
