**Oregon's Best Contests a hit at the Morrow County Fair**

The Oregon's Best Contests are a tradition at the Morrow County Fair. The contests are intended to inspire creativity using Oregon products. This year, contests included Bob's Best Home-Baked Bread Contest, featuring Bob's Red Mill flour and prod-ucts; Down Home Favorites Recipe Contest, sponsored by FLAV-R-PAC and Santiam; Delicious, Nutritious Summer Cheese Recipe Challenge, sponsored by the Dairy Farmers of Oregon; Finest Marionberry Pie in Oregon contest, sponsored by the Oregon Raspberry & Blackberry Commission; and the Hermiston Watermelon contest, sponsored by Hermiston Watermelon Growers.

Bob's Red Mill sponsored the popular Bob's Best Home-Baked Bread Contest. Contestants baked bread from scratch using

Bob's Red Mill products. This year's first place winner was Jan Stroeber. Jan's Herbed Oatmeal Pan Bread used fresh ingredients and Bob's Red Mill flour. She will receive \$50 and two five pound bags of Bob's Red Mill flour.

The Down Home Favorites contestants prepared traditional family dishes using FLAV-R-PAC and Santiam products. There were no entries this year. The first place winner would have received an embroidered apron and a product coupon.

Oregon produced cheese was highlighted in the Delicious, Nutritious Summer Cheese Recipe Challenge sponsored by the Dairy Farmers of Oregon. Contestants use at least one type of Oregon cheese in a snack, salad, main dish, side dish or dessert. The winner would have received a "got

milk" t-shirt and coupons for Oregon-made dairy products for first place, but there were no entries.

The Oregon Rasp-berly and Blackberry com-mission sponsored the 2<sup>nd</sup> annual "Finest Marionberry Pie in Oregon" contest. The winning pies would have won \$20 and been listed on the OregonFresh.net. This was our first year for this contest and we received no entries.

The Hermiston Watermelon Growers' Hermiston Watermelon Seed-Spitting Contest does not involve cooking, but is creative and unique. It is always a big hit in Mor-row County. Contestants were divided into four divi-sions - Men, Women, Youth (8-15 years) and Children (7 years and under). One-by-one, the contestants spit watermelon seeds as far as possible. This year's place

winners are: Men - Paul Keefer, 23'4"; Women - Sierra Gilman, 23'; Youth - Cougar Krosker, 12' 5"; Children - Amanda Barron, 12'

First place winners in each group received a Hermiston Watermelon Lover's Champion Baseball Cap from Hermiston Watermelon Growers.
