-received the following profit/loss statement for the 2008-09 fiscal year: \$6,390,977 in gross patient revenue; \$890,101 in total revenue deductions; \$658,489 in tax revenue; \$102,152 in other operating revenue for \$6,261,518 in total operating revenue; \$6,876,333 in total operating expenses; \$227,659 in non-operating gain for a \$387,155 loss for the year. Mahoney said that the year end financial reports have not yet been completed.

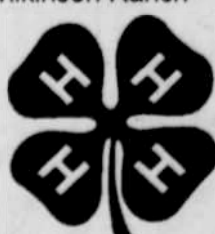
