Sheriff's Report

The Morrow County Sheriff's Office reports handling the following business:

July 25: Morrow County Sheriff's Office received a 911 call regarding a drunk driver in Umatilla.

-MCSO received report from an Irrigon woman that a juvenile male walked into her house, sat on the couch and fell asleep. MCSO cited a juvenile male for MIP. He was released to his mother. MCSO cited Thomas William Baxter, 18, for MIP. The woman did not want to pursue trespassing charges.

-MCSO received report from a Heppner woman that there was a horrible skunk smell in the air and it was hard to breathe.

-MCSO received a relayed report from OSP of a Chihuahua loose in the area, possibly abandoned. OSP had no troopers in the area. A deputy checked the area and was unable to locate anything.
