Sheriff's Report

The Morrow County Sheriff's Office reports handling the following business:

October 10: Morrow County Sheriff's Office cited Frank Wood Gladden, 21, for Open Container. He was lodged at Umatilla County Jail on a Wallowa County Warrant for Failure to Appear/Furnishing Alcohol to a Minor and Minor in Possession. MCSO also cited Dustin Michael Tietze, 19, for MIP-Alcohol and a 16-year-old male juvenile.

-MCSO received a request for traffic control if possible for a funeral in Ione. A deputy responded.
