

Sheriff's Report

The Morrow County Sheriff's Office reports handling the following business:

Oct. 28 cont.:

-BPD warned a subject for no rear lights. A verbal warning was also given to the driver to get his license switched over to Oregon ASAP. The subject advised he was waiting for his birth certificate.

-BPD received report of subjects clearing brush and debris around power lines.

-BPD cited Alvaro Martin Castor, 45, for Driving While Suspended-violation and Driving Uninsured.

-BPD received report from a woman who said someone had been in her shed, but she was not sure if anything was taken. She said her husband had cancer and was not able to get to the shed at this time.

-BPD officer reported he was after a dog at large, but couldn't catch it and would try to follow it home. The dog escaped.

-BPD received report that MCSO was attempting to serve a restraining order on a subject.
