The Heppner Mustangs competed against 18 other track teams in Stanfield on April 16 at the Dick Horyna track meet. The girls took home the team title for the second year in a row, while the boys finished sixth.

Jordan Wright improved his personal best in the javelin by throwing 161 feet and earning third place in the event. His previous best was 136 feet, 10 inches.

Jordan Hatfield ran a season-best time in the 300-meter hurdles while finishing second. Hatfield finished first in the 110 meter hurdles and second in the triple jump.

Alex Pickles was third in the long jump.

The Mustang sprinters dominated the 400 meters. Erin Price ran a district-best time in finishing first. Alana Wilson finished third, and Kellie Nelson finished fourth.

Wilson also finished third in the 200 meters and Nelson finished fifth in the 800 meters.

Price continued her dominance in the hurdle events. She finished first in the 100 meter hurdles and 300 meter hurdles. Brynna Rust was second in the 100 hurdles and third in the 100 meter dash. Emilie Andersen improved on her personal best in the triple jump and finished in second place.

The Mustangs travel to Umatilla for the River's Edge meet this Friday. They will also compete at the Kiwanis Invitational in Hermiston on Saturday.

The Mustangs host next week's meet on April 30.

## National Weather Services to conduct free Weather Spotter training

Volunteers are being sought to participate in the latest weather spotter training on April 27 in Heppner.

The Skywarn Weather Spotter training is free and will be held in the Morrow County Emergency Operations Center, located at 320 South Willow View in Heppner beginning at 6 p.m. and co-sponsored

by Morrow County Emergency Management.

Skywarn spotters attend a two-hour training session where they learn how to observe cloud formations and other weather in this area. The Weather Service teaches how to determine which storms are potentially severe. Spotters use a special toll free number, amateur radio fre-

quency, or the internet address to let the forecasters at the National Weather Service office in Pendleton know what is happening in their area. Meteorologists use this data as they issue severe weather warnings or statements to the residents of Morrow County.

Interested residents who would like to learn more about the local weather

or those who may have an interest helping your neighbors obtain good weather warnings, are invited to attend the SkyWarn Weather Spotter training. Volunteers are asked to bring information about their latitude, longitude, and elevation so their locations can be easily mapped.

If you are unable to attend on April 27, there will be live internet training on Monday, April 26. More information about the training is available by contacting Morrow County Emergency Management at 541-676-5161 or the National Weather Service at 541-276-4493 ext 223.
