

Mustangs win team title at Columbia River Invitational

The Heppner Mustang track team traveled to Boardman on May 8 for the Columbia River Invitational. The girls beat out 18 other teams to claim the team trophy. The boys earned third place. This was a tune-up meet for the Mustangs, who will be competing at their district meet this Saturday.

Jordan Hatfield was a bright spot for the Mustangs. He earned four first place finishes - 110 hurdles, 300 hurdles, triple jump, and 4x100 meter relay. Catherine McElligott ran a district-best time while placing second in the 400 meters, and the girls' 4x400 relay team ran a season best time and finished first.

The Mustangs next meet is the Blue Mountain Conference District Meet in

Stanfield on Saturday, May 15. Field events begin at 11 a.m. and running events begin at 1 p.m. The top two finishers in each event qualify for the state track meet, which will be held next weekend in Monmouth. Eight women got together and called themselves the North Ione Improvement Club. They had planned meetings each month where they read books and discussed various topics. year were 50 cents.

The Topic Club had a motto "The more we think, the more we live." And so the group grew until they limited their membership to 24. In 1933 they chose the library as something badly needed in Ione. They have been the sole sponsors of the city library ever since. The library was

housed around town in various stores and building until the city hall was built in 1952 and a large corner room became a permanent home for the library. The library was enlarged to twice its size in 2006 with a grant from WildHorse Casino, generous support from the community and a donation of book shelves

from the high school when the school was renovated.

Currently, the library has a six week reading program each summer for elementary students, hosts a preschool visit each month and brings several evening programs in for the public to enjoy. It is open on Monday's and Wednesday's from 3-7 p.m. each week.
