### Boardman adopts 2010-2011 city and URA budgets

During their June 1 meetings, the Boardman City Council adopted the 2010-2011 City budget of \$6,476,633 and the Urban Renewal Agency adopted their 2010-2011 budget of \$332,000. Property taxes will be levied at a rate of \$4.2114 per \$1000 of assessed valuation and \$475,000 will be levied for bonded indebtedness not subject to Measure 5 or

Measure 50 limitations. City Finance Director, Thomas Kligel said the general fund budget is tight this year due to the lack of cash carryover from the 2009-2010 budget. He anticipates using much of the 2010-2011 reserve funds on the South Main Street curbs and sidewalks construction project.

In other city business, Councilors approved

the printing of 1000 Development Incentives Brochures to be distributed the month of July. The council also approved an intergovernmental agreement with Morrow County for road maintenance on mutual roads.

The next meeting of the Boardman City Council will be Tuesday, June 15, at 7 p.m.
