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## Healy's receive Yard of the Month award for June

The Heppner Garden Club has chosen Carmen and Jerry Healy's home as the first Yard of the Month for the 2010 season.

Built in 1948 by Jim Farley, the Healy's have been home at 645 Hagar Street since 1978. They have made the house their own by remodeling and adding on, the latest addition being a new and open kitchen.

In their back yard, the couple added a covered patio, deck and terraces. From their front steps to the backyard ending below a basalt rock bluff, there are four levels of terracing.

Lawn mowing is done by Jerry while Carmen is the official gardener and weed puller. She has literally filled every corner of their property with plants. A native of Dominican Republic, the men in her family traditionally did all the outdoor work including "growing everything we ate." The women tended to all indoor work. Nevertheless, Carmen gardens with a passion that came from "needing a hobby."

Jerry, manager of Columbia Basin Electric Co-op and Heppner native, has brought wagon wheels and an antique wheelbarrow from his family's ranch to decorate the yard. His favorite planting is the mature, sprawling apricot tree that gives shade in the back.

A white picket fence was added to their front yard that is also lined with perennials and annuals. The covered front porch the Healy's added faces a quiet residential street and Hagar Park which is a change from first moving in. Then, their street was the main route following Willow Creek to the mountains and busy with traffic. Later, they and their children, Joseph, Jo-

nas and Janelle, had a front row seat to the construction of Willow Creek Dam.

Carmen's favorite part of the yard is a raised front bed built with landscape blocks and her favorite plants are her bright yellow daylilies.

Some of the plants found in their yard are carnations, gazanias, marigolds, clematis vine, lilac, Alberta Spruce, arborvitae, forsythia, pink gladioli, dianthus, daisies, Russian Sage, spirea, azalea, mums, barberry shrubs, apple tree, peach tree, coral bells, campanula, Snow on the Mountain, peony, Blue Star juniper, sweet woodruff and iris. Jacob's Ladder and an undetermined variety of tree volunteer throughout.

Vegetables include carrots, radishes, cucumbers, tomatoes and a large quantity of robust looking broccoli. Carmen raises herbs to use in cooking, a talent she has in addition to

her green thumb.

Their soil is good with lots of earthworms and they haven't needed to fertilize much. Red rock and river rock have been hauled in to use for different projects. A current project is putting up a cyclone fence in a side yard.

The Healy's have been visited by wildlife such as deer and lots of birds including cranes. On the tamer side is their adorable Boston Terrier, Donnie.

When asked what advice they have for fellow gardeners, both Jerry and Carmen mentioned 'a lot of work'. But, their laughter gave them away; they enjoy what they are doing and their home and garden show it.

## Navy Airman finds new homeport in San Diego

Navy Airman Brandon R. Wheeler, whose wife, Sandra, is the daughter of Maria Del Carmen Medina of Boardman, along with 3, 500 crew members, assigned to the Nimitz-class aircraft carrier USS Carl Vinson (CVN 70) recently arrived at the ship's new homeport at Naval Air Station North Island, San-
