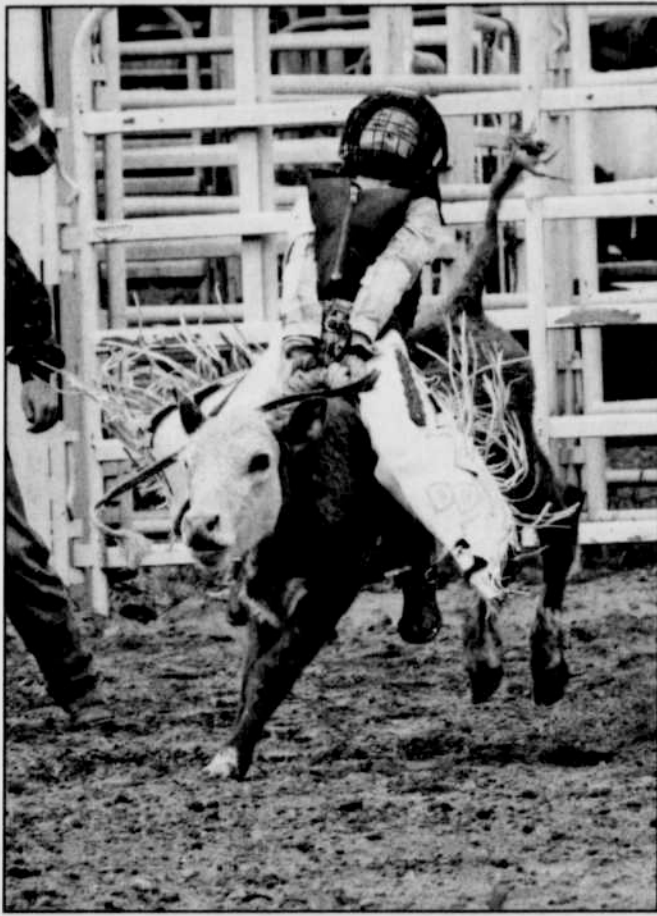


Locals contestants participate in CJRA Rodeo

Calling all M. C. cultural, arts, historic and literary organizations

Morrow County Cultural Coalition announces revisions to their application guidelines to match the coalition fiscal year. Revisions give proposals selected for funding more time to complete their projects. Morrow County literary, historical preservation, visual and performing arts, humanities and cultural organizations are invited to submit proposals to Morrow County Cultural Coalition by August 1.

Organizations need not have IRS tax-exempt status to apply. Project proposals must meet criteria noted on the Morrow County application. Funding awarded will vary in amount, according to needs of the proposed project, and county award from Oregon Cultural Trust. Grants are awarded for no more than 50% of the total project cost. Proposals funded in 2010 included: \$1,850 to North Morrow Community Foundation to match total Project Expense of \$3,600 for a Missoula Children's Theater residency to benefit 50 Irrigon and Boardman youth; \$1,200 toward a \$2,400 request to purchase Lavalier microphones, stage lights and rent costumes for "Dinner at the Cemetery" Players; and \$1,000 toward a \$11,040 project to start a string music program at the Ione Community Elementary School.

To receive a funding proposal request form, contact Mary Lou Daltoso, Morrow County Cultural Coalition, P.O. Box 3 Boardman, OR 97818. Completed request forms must be returned by August 1, 2010. Proposed projects must be completed by June 1, 2011.

The lunch meeting will start at noon at Heppner City Hall. The cost for lunch is \$9. Next week's caterer will be The Stable of Youth.

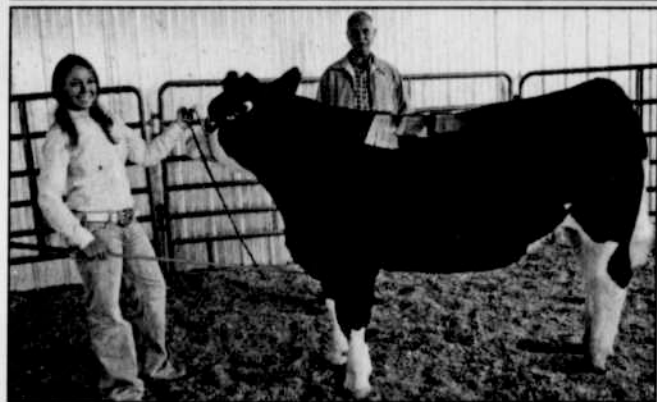
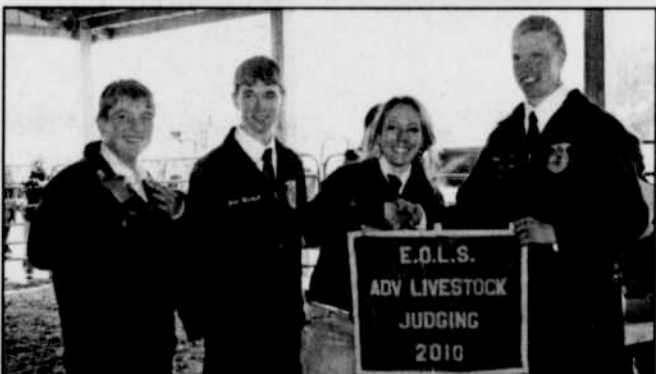
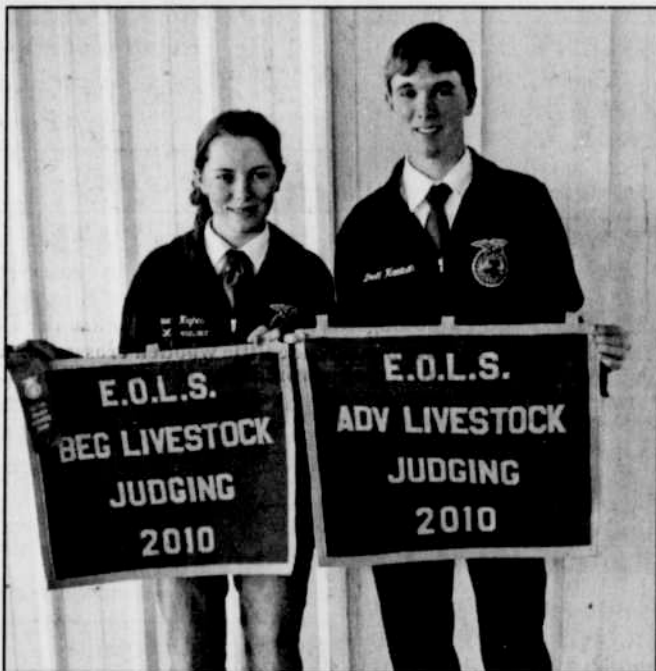
