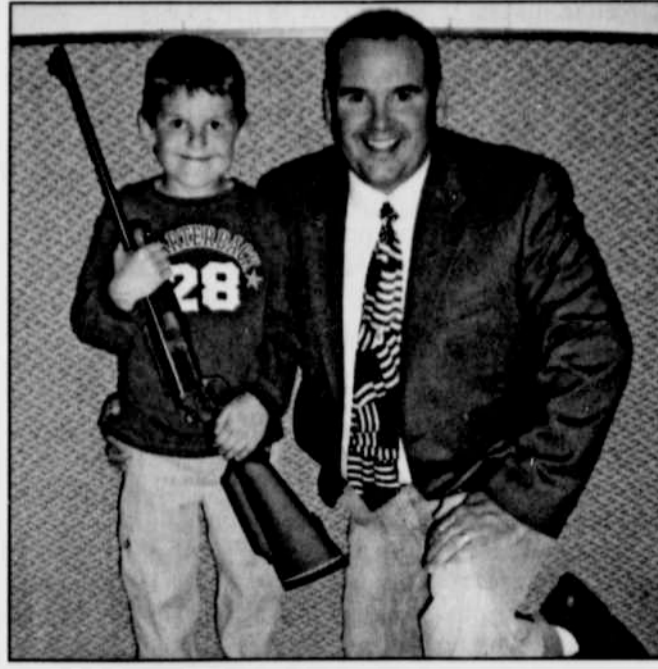


Local students make honor roll at Oregon State University

Sheriff's Report

The Morrow County Sheriff's Office reports handling the following business:

-MCSO received report that a male subject made threats to kill another male in Irrigon. The threats were concerning water rights on one subject's property. Upon investigation MCSO determined that there was no death threat made and no calls made and the issue was a civil matter.
