tain a good relationship with the (CRCHS) clinic," said Blauer. "Basically we want to support you, but we want you to do some things. We want to work with you." He said that the district wants an application letter for the requested funds and wants a financial report. "If we're giving a sizeable amount of money, we would like to get credit," said MCHD Chief Financial Officer Nicole Mahoney. "We want to be collaborative," added Blauer. "We're interested in their community's health as much as they are."

-learned from Blauer that the purchase of a CT scanner is temporarily on hold while the district waits on paperwork on a low interest loan to purchase the scanner to be completed. The paperwork will then have to be sent off to USDA. He said the district is contemplating purchase of a Toshiba scanner.

-learned from Blauer that the district

has been invited to apply for a grant from the M.J. Murdock Charitable Trust. The district has applied for a \$90,000 grant.

-learned from Blauer that a group of district employees traveled to Snoqualmie to research an electronic records system, but has not as yet made a decision on the appropriate system to purchase. The group had earlier traveled to a facility in Chelan to investigate their system.

-approve purchase of a Toyota Corolla from Toyota of Tri-Cities for the low bid of \$15,843.60 to replace an aging vehicle for use by Home Health and Hospice nurses.

-learned from Mahoney that the district had a \$37,284 profit for the month and a \$240,740 gain for the year. However, she said that the district is still anticipating paying a \$105,000 cost settlement back to Medicare.

-received the following report: Pioneer Memorial Hospital had four

admissions for June, one swing bed admission, 10 admitted for observation, 522 outpatient admissions, 63 total emergency room encounters, 1669 lab tests, 139 x-ray procedures, 33 CT scans, 24 EKG tests, three treadmill procedures, seven colonoscopy procedures, one endoscopy procedure, 10 respiratory therapy procedures; Pioneer Memorial Clinic had 433 patient visits with 24 new patients, 51 patients seen by a nurse and 10 no shows; Irrigon Medical Center had 173 patient visits, 12 new patients, 38 seen by a nurse and 13 no shows; Boardman Ambulance had 31 total page-outs with 18 transports for \$20,449 in revenue; Irrigon Ambulance had 26 page-outs with 11 transports for \$10,404 in revenue; Heppner Ambulance had 17 page-outs with 15 transports for \$15,113 in revenue, there were two flights; Home Health had 83 patient visits; pharmacy had 781 drug doses for \$50,797 in drug revenue
