University of Idaho announces spring 2010 graduation candidates

As of this spring, the total number of graduates from the University of Idaho, the state's land-grant institution, stands at just over 100,000. A total of 1,446 students were eligible for graduation this May from the University of Idaho. These include 1,075 baccalaureate degrees, 252 master's degrees, 83 law degrees and 34 doctoral degrees.

The University of Idaho held five commencement ceremonies around the state: in Boise on May 5; in Idaho Falls on May 6; in Coeur d'Alene on
