

Second annual Hall of Fame for Ione High School held

On Saturday, October 2, the community of Ione celebrated the induction of 51 outstanding students, teachers, 1960 winning state champion football team and coaches. This year's ceremony took in the years 1935 to 1970. In 2009 there were 52 inductees from 1922 to 1960.

The Hall of Fame is to honor outstanding individuals who, through their exceptional achievements have brought honor to themselves, Ione High School, and the Ione community. The Ione Cardinal Booster Club sponsors this event. Nominations are accepted from January through June each year. The selection committee reviews and recommends the list to the Cardinal Booster Club and the Board of Directors.

DA's Report

The Morrow County District Attorney's Office has released the following report:

-Robert Edward Flanagan, 35, was convicted of Attempt to Commit a Class C/Unclassified Felony - Possession of Meth, a Class A misdemeanor, and was sentenced to 90 days incarceration with 90 days suspended, two years bench probation, complete 32 hours of community service, other conditions, and pay \$738 in fines, fees, and assessments.

-Marion Taylor III, 50, was convicted of Assault in the Fourth Degree, a Class A misdemeanor, and was sentenced to one year incarceration and other conditions. Taylor was also convicted of Harassment, a Class B misdemeanor.

-Andrey Vasilovich Kleymenov, 32, was convicted of Possession of Heroin, a Class B felony, and was sentenced to 18 months supervised probation, 90 sanction units with 30 jail units, other conditions, and pay \$1,763 in fines, fees, and assessments.

4-H Rocket Club being organized

Pat Struthers of Heppner is organizing a new 4-H Model Rocketry Club. The first orientation meeting is tentatively scheduled for Thursday, October 28, at 7 p.m. at the Morrow County Extension Office.

Struthers would like to limit the group to six members (4th through 10th grade) for this year, although the size of the group could be expanded if demand and community support warrant it. The club will try to organize a public demonstration launch for late October/early November if weather permits.

The 4-H Rocketry program will entail some serious commitment on the part of both parents and youth, in keeping with all 4-H activities. The club currently has considerable funds to get started, but donations will certainly be appreciated. A 'Launch Box' will be available to new members for \$50; this package includes three rocket kits, motors, construction tools and supplies, as well as launch supplies and a rugged plastic storage box. Navy and National Guard to hold public open house scoping meetings for Naval Weapons Systems Training Facility Boardman

The U.S. Navy, in cooperation with the National Guard Bureau and the Oregon National Guard, is in the initial stages of preparing an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) to evaluate potential environmental effects associated with current and proposed military training and testing activities at Naval Weapons Systems Training Facility (NWSTF) Boardman.

Two open house scoping meetings will be held from 5 - 8 p.m. at the following locations: Port of Morrow Conference Center, Riverfront Room, on October 27; and Hermiston Conference Center, Rotary Room, on October 28.

The Navy and the National Guard are initiating the scoping process to identify community concerns and issues for analysis

in the EIS. The Navy and the National Guard are seeking public involvement and input, which are fundamental parts of the EIS development under the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA). As part of the public participation process, the Navy and the National Guard will hold open house meetings in Oregon to obtain public input on the scope of the NWSTF Boardman EIS.

The Navy and the National Guard propose to implement actions to increase certain military training activities from current levels to support Navy and Oregon National Guard requirements; develop appropriate ranges and facilities; accommodate mission requirements associated with force structure changes

and the introduction of new weapons systems; implement range enhancements; and maintain current training activities.

The proposed action would result in selectively focused but critical enhancements and increases in training that are necessary to ensure NWSTF Boardman supports military training and readiness objectives. The NWSTF Boardman EIS will analyze potential environmental effects from the training of U.S. military forces in military airspace above and land training areas within the boundaries of NWSTF Boardman.

The public is invited to attend open house style scoping meetings for information about the proposed action and to provide comments on factors to be considered in the EIS. The

public may arrive at any time during each scoping meeting. There will be no formal presentation; however, Navy and National Guard representatives will be on hand to discuss the project and the proposed action.

All written comments must be postmarked or received during the comment period to be considered in the Draft EIS. Written comments must be postmarked by November 15, 2010, and mailed to: Naval Facilities Engineering Command, Northwest, Attn: Mrs. Amy Burt - NWSTF Boardman EIS Project Manager, 1101 Tautog Circle, Suite 203, Silverdale, WA 98315-1101.
